Food Security, Public Safety, Health & Safety (vaccination on flu & covid booster) shots available. Job openings, Youth employment through the tribe and community. Travel awareness summer & winter months. KZPA works well with KSKO, KRFF.

River watch (flood), Forest Fire update (Yukon Flats) KZPA is a vital part on getting messages and live call-in to the listening audience in and outside of Fort Yukon. Messages to the family living on the trapline or homestead. KZPA has local business signed up for underwriting.

Few locals speak the Gwitchin language fluently. English language is mainly spoken.

KZPA purchased and had new equipment installed at the generator site and at the KZPA radio station in 2024. Paid for DF (generator) and heating fuel for the office tank. Hired B & B Electric for updates at the generator site, KZPA building. Hired two part-time DJ's. Purchase building material (fence) at Gen. site. Pay monthly bills, Employees, In the near future hire Maintenance person, Redo the bathroom, steps, roof to the KZPA building. Thank you for your support.
